Criteria	Greatest Impact	Reflection Questions	My Thinking
Dedicated Wall Spaces	<ul> <li>Students recognize where to look to find specific types of information.</li> <li>The prime wall spaces are dedicated to current learning.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>How can I utilize prime classroom wall spaces most effectively?</li> <li>How can I use consistent spaces so students can locate information easily?</li> </ul>	Example: Placing items in a consistent location helps students know exactly where to look to find the information they need. Next year, I will dedicate spaces by content area.
Lesson Essential Question	<ul> <li>Lesson Essential Question is displayed in a consistent location at the front of the room or in a designated subject/course location where it can be used to introduce the lesson and be easily referred to throughout the lesson.</li> <li>Key vocabulary is highlighted and emphasized.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Where will I post Lesson Essential Questions to ensure all students can see them?</li> <li>Will the dedicated spot be visible enough to me to prompt my referring to it frequently throughout the lesson?</li> <li>Have I left myself space around the question to highlight key vocabulary?</li> </ul>	
Content Vocabulary Displays	<ul> <li>Vocabulary represents current content.</li> <li>Vocabulary is visually organized by concept.</li> <li>Students can easily visualize connections among terms/concepts.</li> <li>Terms/concepts are in a subject specific area and can be easily seen and used by all students.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Will I be able to easily access the words to update them regularly?</li> <li>Will students be able to locate and see these words easily?</li> <li>Are words organized into clear concepts, categories?</li> <li>Does the background distract from the words themselves?</li> </ul>	
Anchor Charts	<ul> <li>Anchor Charts are referred to and used throughout instruction.</li> <li>Current Anchor Charts are displayed in a prominent location organized by subject and can be easily viewed and used by all students.</li> <li>Previous charts are archived in a location where students can still access them.</li> <li>The room is free of visuals that do not support current learning expectations.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Where do I post current Anchor Charts?</li> <li>Are any Anchor Charts needed for a long time frame?</li> <li>How can I archive Anchor Charts so that students can access them when needed?</li> </ul>	
Student Work Displays	<ul> <li>Posted student work reflects more recent Assignments.</li> <li>There is a clear alignment to the standard and Lesson Essential Question.</li> </ul>	If displaying inside the classroom, does the display avoid more prime wall space?
